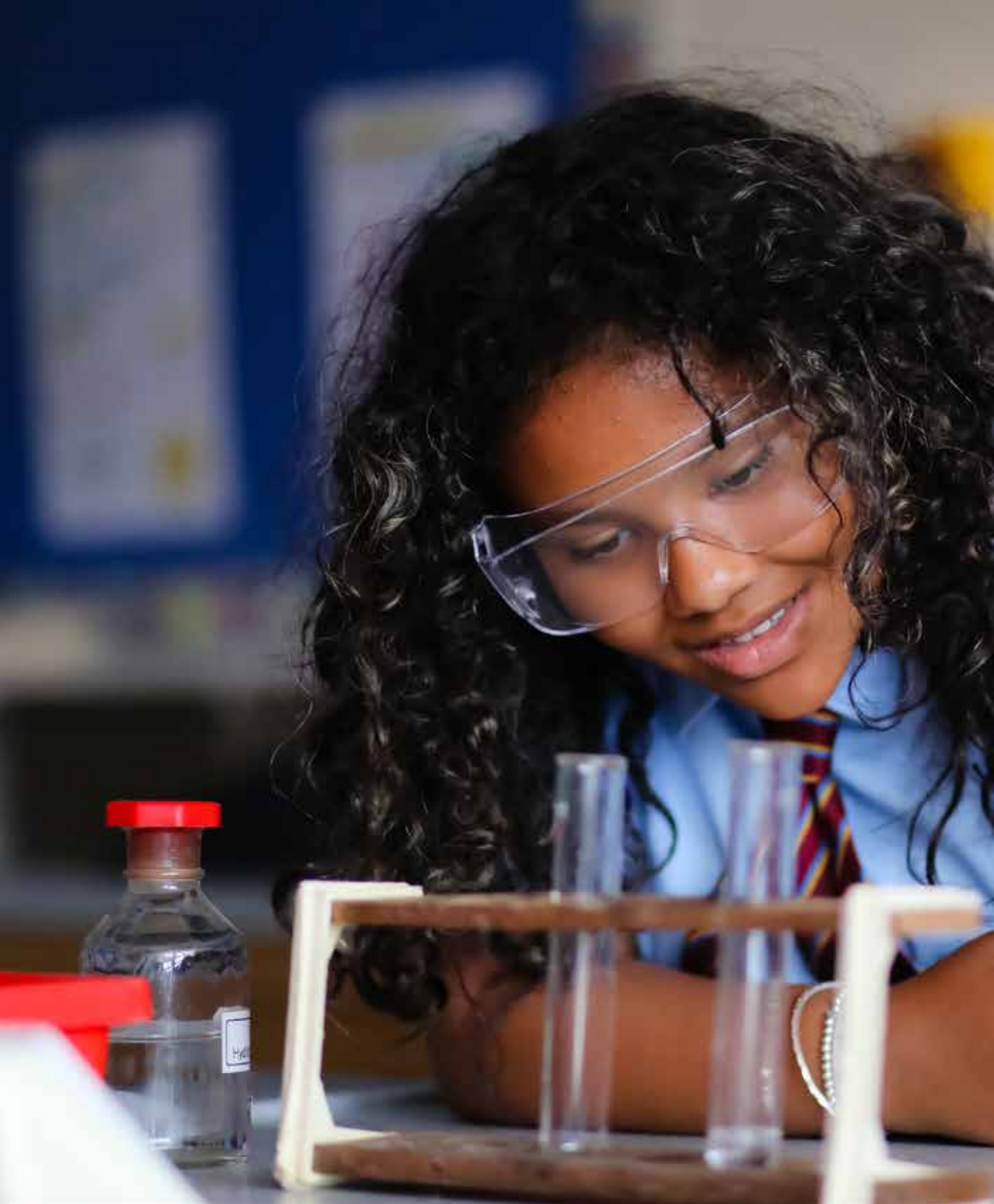

Learning through challenge

At Range High School the quality of GCSE grades or 'Attainment 8' has remained significantly higher than local and national levels since their introduction. This is consistently among the best in Sefton. The number of pupils making better than expected progress in a range of subjects is also consistently higher than the national figure.

Most of our pupils choose to study in our thriving sixth form where achievement at Level 3 (A-Level and vocational courses) is similarly high, with students achieving places on apprenticeships and the university courses of their choice, including a large number starting courses at prestigious Russell Group universities.

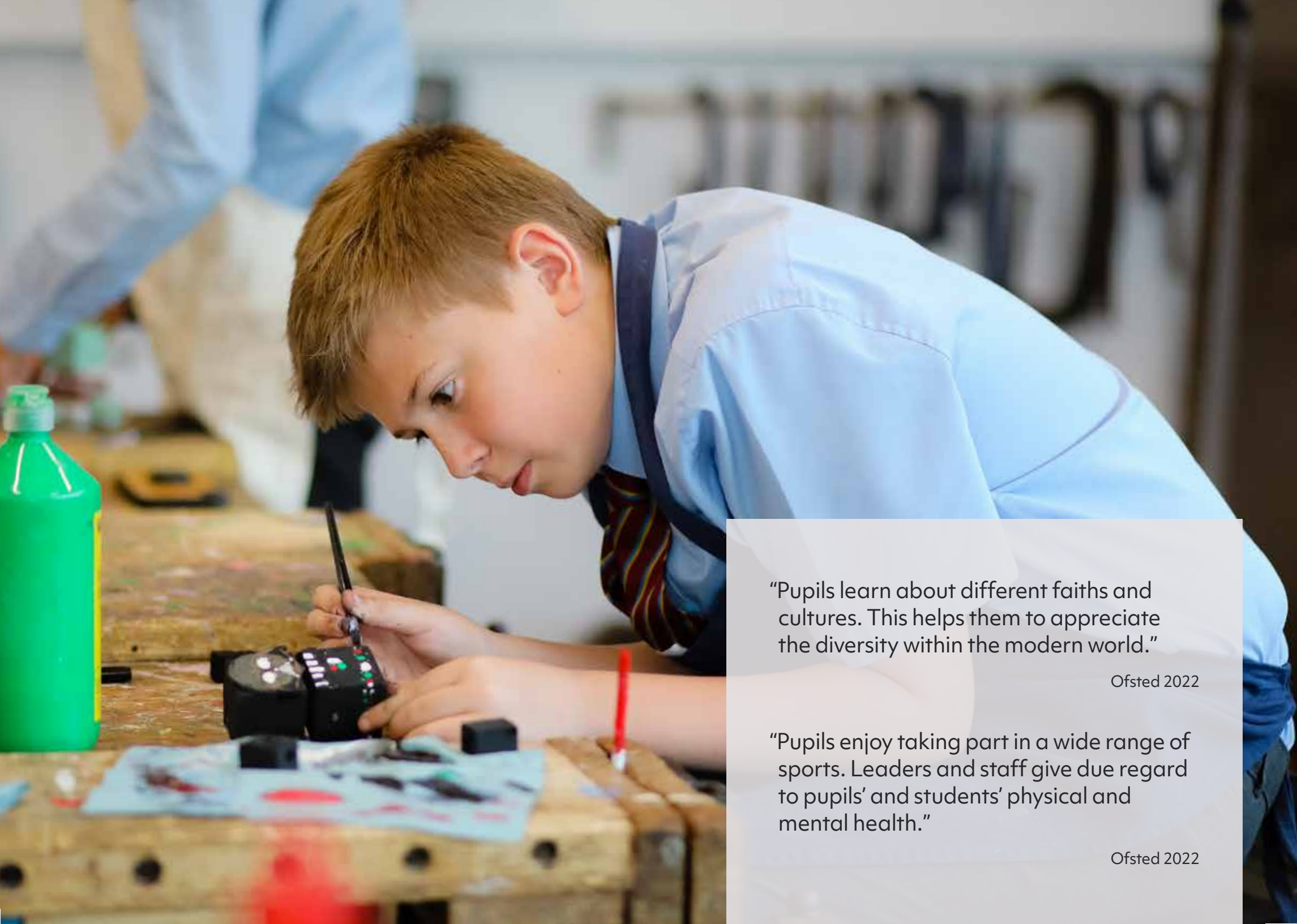
We challenge all our pupils to achieve academically through a varied and personalised curriculum.

We pride ourselves on our curriculum offer. There are a variety of courses to study in Science and Computing. Our Maths and Computer programmes give our pupils many transferable skills in this digital age.

Our PE programmes of study are broad and varied, and there are many opportunities for pupils to develop their sporting and dance talents to different levels. Many of our pupils play sport at county level and beyond. The breadth and quality of our PE programmes have led us to be named Sefton Sports School of the Year on four occasions.

Pupils are also challenged to develop as young adults, supporting younger pupils as literacy and numeracy mentors, sports captains and year council representatives, undertaking the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme and supporting local and national charity schemes.

Growing in a supportive environment

Our year system ensures that each pupil is looked after and their progress monitored by their Head and Assistant Head of Year in addition to their Form Tutor throughout their time at the school.

We expect and maintain high standards of behaviour and pupils take seriously the responsibility they have to make our school a calm and safe place to learn.

Our team of learning mentors and peer mentors are available to offer support when it is needed.

Pupils with different needs are supported by a large, highly skilled team of teaching assistants to help them to achieve their potential across the curriculum including PE and expressive arts subjects.

Our Inclusion Team is ably led by our experienced SENDCO and we have our own qualified nurse on the premises each day.

A specialist team delivers literacy and numeracy support to pupils if and as they need it, and there are differentiated pathways through the curriculum for pupils of different abilities.

The school and year councils give pupils the opportunity to give their views and to shape and contribute to the development of the school.

Learning through new opportunities

Our half-termly 'career days' provide time to explore topics in depth, to learn outside the classroom in different groups and with input from invited speakers. Both our Year 11 and Year 12 students get the opportunity to complete a full week of work experience allowing them to develop new skills and make more informed choices on their future.

We also run regular careers fairs, inviting large numbers of employers, apprenticeship providers, colleges and universities into school to meet our students.

We are the largest Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme centre in Sefton and support all pupils who take part.

We offer several international trips every year including destinations such as Iceland, Spain and France as well as our Italian ski trip. All of this is in addition to many local and national trips to enhance our students' learning experience of many aspects of the curriculum.

Pupils develop team skills and confidence through mixed-aged visits to outward-bound centres, such as Winmarleigh Hall in Lancashire. Our pupils are also involved in charity fundraising and significant events such as 'Matthew's Mile' and sponsorship of the East Meru Community School in Tanzania.

Our wealth of performing arts activities include drama groups, choirs, orchestras, jazz bands and dance groups. Individual instrumental lessons are also available. Our annual 'Arts Star' competition gives all pupils the opportunity to showcase their creative talents and develop performance skills. Concerts in school and in the community give performers the chance to shine. Our commitment to the arts of all kinds is recognised in our Artsmark award.

Pupils have the opportunity to be involved in work experience and also take part in activities designed to develop them as entrepreneurs with a strong understanding of business and trading.

At Range High School our pupils learn to take responsibility, to become an active member of our school community and to contribute to the learning and development of others.

The vast majority of our pupils continue their education in our thriving sixth form, where their progress and development continue to be supported by a specialist pastoral team.

In the sixth form students make use of the transferable skills they have learnt by acting as mentors for other pupils, by increasing their independence in preparation for higher education and employment, and by following our extensive enrichment programme.
