Southport Learning Trust is a multi-academy Trust created in 2017 when Greenbank High School formed a partnership in a Trust with Stanley High School.



A challenging curriculum for all

Our aim is to provide a broad, balanced curriculum which promotes the development of all students and which prepares them for the next stages of their education and employment when they leave Stanley High.

Engaging, high quality learning opportunities ensure that students are inspired by specialist subject staff and the development of literacy and numeracy are the foundation of our curriculum.

Our curriculum has been developed and designed to enable all students to achieve at Stanley High and offers a variety of rich learning experiences which cater for students of all academic abilities. The curriculum in Years 7, 8 and 9 includes all core and foundation subjects and from Year 10 the students can begin to consider personalising their curriculum with an extensive choice of subjects available. Students requiring learning support or who may need some supplementary interventions are well supported through bespoke curriculum pathways.





Caring, nurturing pastoral support

We believe that by creating a nurturing atmosphere in which all students feel happy, valued and supported they are able to achieve their full potential. We are committed to providing a personal approach that treats all students as individuals and encourages them to flourish.

On joining the school, students are allocated a tutor group which is created through the transition work with our local primary schools. The key person for your child will be their Form Tutor. You can expect the Form Tutor to make regular contact with you to ensure that your child is happy, secure and cared for during their time at Stanley High. Each year group has a Year Leader who will monitor progress, attendance, rewards, behaviour and offer guidance to students in their year. Student Mentors support new students joining the school and help them settle into school life very quickly.

We offer a range of additional support for students who may require academic mentoring or pastoral guidance. Under the guidance of our SENDCO, we have great expertise and experience in supporting students who have specified learning needs and students have personalised pathways to support their learning. Experienced Academic Mentors and Pastoral Support Workers ensure that all students and their families feel fully supported and valued, and respond quickly when pastoral issues arise.





Enhancing learning

Students at Stanley High are given a wide range of inspirational learning experiences outside the classroom to support their personal development and enhance learning opportunities.

An extensive array of extra-curricular activities across the school enables students to flourish, especially in the performing arts with numerous excellent productions that showcase the talents of our students. We have a proud history of boys' and girls' sporting success in many disciplines at a local, regional and national level. This is supported by an extensive programme of extra-curricular provision in both individual and team sports. The Duke of Edinburgh Award is popular and is offered to all Year 9 students at Bronze Award level and to students who wish to pursue their Silver Award in Year 10.

Opportunities to learn outside of the classroom develop students' cultural awareness and global appreciation. We have educational visits to enhance the school curriculum, both within the UK and abroad. During recent years, we have visited Poland, Austria, France, London, Iceland and Colomendy.

The school is at the heart of the local community and works closely with our local primary and secondary schools. We have a long-standing tradition of raising money and awareness for local and international charities. This is part of our commitment to educating the 'whole child' and preparing our students to be active and successful citizens.



Building for the future

As a school we are committed to ensuring our students' aspirations are achievable and through leadership opportunities and partnership working, students are well prepared for steps after Stanley High.

The Student Leadership Team, consisting of our Head Boy and Head Girl, are instrumental in supporting leadership and giving the students an active voice in shaping the school. There are a large number of opportunities for students to develop leadership skills across the school as Prefects, Sports Leaders, Literacy Leaders, Language Leaders or as a member of the School Council.


