

Kew Woods celebrated British



During the sessions, which were delivered separately to children, families and staff, Karl discussed the good and the not so good on the Internet and particular applications, including WhatsApp, TikTok and SnapChat.

The sessions focused on making people aware of issues surrounding the Apps, in particular safeguarding concerns that can arise when children have unsolicited accesses to such sites and the possible consequences.

## INCLUSIVITY IS KEY FOR YEAR 4 BOYS

Year 4 boys have worked on a continuing project with **The Inclusive Hub**, which provides bespoke fitness and education sessions to schools, on several areas including physical and mental fitness. The projects have focused on developing pupils' self-awareness to the lifestyle choices they make; the impact of social media and how to use strategies to regulate their emotions, including speaking out when feeling uncomfortable.



## SEND SEFTON YOUTH CONFERENCE

Year 11 students represented Maghull High School at the SEND Sefton Youth Conference. Students spoke about SEND in school and in the community. The conference focused on four key strands of the **Preparation for Adulthood: Employment/education, Relationships and community, Independent living & Good health**. Facilitators described students as being 'impeccable' throughout the day for their behaviour and engagement.



## OVERCOMING THE ODDS - REBECCA'S STORY

When Rebecca was a Year 7 student, her life took an unexpected turn with the sudden onset of severe Tourette's syndrome. Recognising the need for awareness, Range provided training for both staff and students—some led by Rebecca's parents. With this understanding and inclusive environment, Rebecca was gradually reintroduced to school life. In the beginning, she required constant support from two teaching assistants due to the severity of her condition. But as the years passed, her independence grew.



By Year 11, she needed only minimal support, and by Years 12 and 13, occasional check-ins for emotional well-being were all that was required. Her perseverance paid off—she successfully completed her A levels and is now pursuing her lifelong dream of becoming a primary school teacher, studying at Hope University. A huge congratulations Rebecca, we are all very proud of you and wish you every success in your future career as a teacher.



## DARTS FOR GHANA

Birkdale boys held a charity darts competition to raise funds for a partner school in Ghana, with the top five scorers in each group going into a prize draw. Other fund raising activities have included a tuck shop, an Own Clothes Day, and collection of donated clothing, with sponsored events taking place after exams.



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## VAWG EVENT

A group of Year 8 students participated in a **\*Violence Against Women and Girls\*** event, organised by Merseyside Police and the LFC Foundation. The event provided a crucial platform for discussing the challenges faced by women and girls in society and exploring ways to create a safer, more respectful future. By engaging in these conversations, our students are developing their awareness, empathy, and understanding—empowering them to be advocates for change.



## MENTAL HEALTH WEEK

KS1 watched a performance from Altru Drama 'Sunflowers and Stormy Days'. They used the garden as a metaphor for mental health and helping pupils explore feelings, emotions and wellbeing.


